For Homelessness & Hunger Awareness week, Schoke JFS hosted close to sixty volunteers across our two offices in Fairfield and Stamford, including several members from the Congregation for Humanistic Judaism in Westport, making for a day of fantastic community engagement and volunteering.

Between the two sites, we packed an estimated six hundred personal care kits. These kits are distributed through the Freedberg Family Kosher Food Pantry, Kosher Mobile Food Pantry, and case managers to their clients.

Feeding the Community: Schoke JFS adds additional Mobile Food Pantry sites

In our ongoing commitment to address food insecurity in the community, Schoke JFS expanded its monthly Kosher Mobile Food Pantry partner sites to include Mercy Learning Center (MLC) in Bridgeport, CT. MLC provides basic literacy and life skills training to women with low income using a holistic approach.

During the first Mercy Learning Center distribution, the Mobile Food Pantry provided food and nourishment to 223 individuals from 80 households, marking our second-largest distribution to date!

In addition. the Mobile Food Pantry also added a new monthly distribution at **Stern Village** in Trumbull, CT. Stern Village offers affordable housing for low-income seniors and those with disabilities.

These new partner sites allows us to reach even more people in need including over 100 new households!
